 - Iwi Health Service provider
 - Only Iwi owned Hospital in NZ
 - Covers a coastal region spanning 200km's (124 miles)
 - Its rural and isolated
 - Its picturesque, a unique way of life
 - High level of deprivation with a declining population



Snapshot of NPH's story

- 1905 Waiapu Hospital – Pastoral Farming-European community
- 1995 Ngāti Porou Hauora Incorporated Society – Community owned and governed
- 2011 Ngāti Porou Hauora Charitable Trust – subsidiary to Te Runanga o Ngāti Porou
 - History of great leadership, forward looking, research focussed
 - Move to save the organisation / keep Ngāti Porou led Health Services on the East Coast
 - Coastal area has a population of 4,300 of which 89% are Māori
 - Urban area has a population of 7,100 of which 78% are Māori



Cultural Innovation

The (now national) Wahakura safe-sleep program which uses traditional weaving practices is just one of many examples of Ngāti Porou innovation and leadership in indigenous health practice

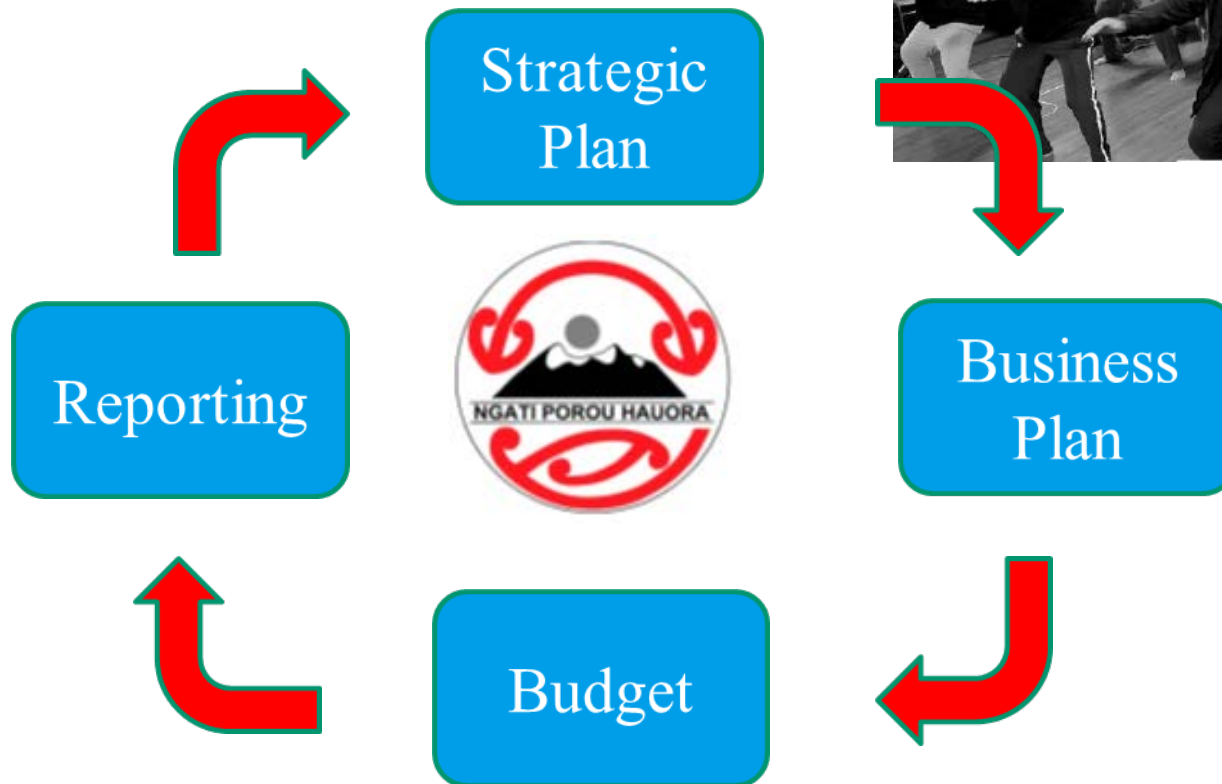
